The major terms and conditions of appointment of the above Independent Directors are as under:

- 1. Term of Appointment:
  - 1.1. The appointments of Independent Directors are for a period of (five) years form the date of their respective appointment. The Independent directors are not liable to retire by rotation. Reappointment at the end of their tenure shall be considered by the board of Directors ("the Board) based on the recommendation of the Nomination and Remuneration Committee and the performance evaluation process, subject to the Directors continuing to meet the independence criteria.
  - 1.2. The Independent Directors may be nominated to be a Member or Chairman of any one or more Committees of the Board.
- 2. Role, Function and Duties:
  - 2.1. The role, functions and duties of the Independent Directors shall be in accordance with the provisions of Schedule IV (Code of Independent Directors) to the Act, which *inter alia* includes:
  - 2.2. As member of the Board, the Independent Directors along with other Directors will be collectively responsible for meeting the objectives of the Board, Viz.,

2.2.1. Requirements under the Act and rules framed thereunder.



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- 2.2.2. Responsibilities of the Board in relation to Corporate Governance as outlined in Clause 49 of the Listing Agreement and TPL's Code for the Independent Directors.
- 2.2.3. Accountability under Director's Responsibility Statement which forms part of the Board's Report to the shareholders.
- 2.2.4. Review of Companies business strategy, financial plan and monitor the performance of the Company.
- 2.2.5. Safeguarding the interest of all stakeholders.
- 2.2.6. Advice and counsel the management in the respective area of expertise

## 3. Remuneration

- 3.1. The Independent Directors shall be paid sitting fees for attending the meetings of the Board and the Committees of which they are members. The sitting fees payable shall be determined by the Board from time to time.
- 3.2.   - 4.2. Unless specifically authorized by the Company, the Independent Director shall keep confidential all information concerning the Company and shall not divulge or disclose the same to any person during the term of their appointment. Their obligation of confidentiality shall survive cessation of their directorships with the Company.



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4.3. The provisions of Securities and Exchange Board of India (Prohibition of Insider Trading) Regulations, 1992 and TPL's Code of Conduct for Prevention of Insider Trading, as amended form time to time, prohibiting disclosure or use of unpublished price sensitive information shall be applicable to the Independent Directors.

### 5. Insurance

5.1. The Company has taken appropriate Director's and Officer's Liability Insurance Policy and has paid premium for the same. The Company shall continue to maintain such insurance cover during the term of the Independent Directors appointment.
